

Jesse B. Hall, MD, FCCP

Dr Jesse Hall is a Professor of Medicine and Anesthesia and Critical Care, and Section Chief of Pulmonary and Critical Care at the University of Chicago. He earned his medical degree and completed his residency and fellowship at the University of Chicago, continuing on at this institution building a career devoted to clinical investigation and clinical scholarship. His focus has been to evolve the critical care units as sites for exemplary patient care, classrooms for students of critical care, and laboratories for the study of the pathophysiology of and outcomes from critical illness.

Dr. Hall's research interests include mechanisms and treatment of cardiopulmonary failure, pathophysiology of sepsis, pharmacology in the ICU, and outcomes from critical illness. His research group has conducted more than 75 research protocols focused on these areas, enrolling more than 4500 patients in both single and multi-center studies.

Dr. Hall has published more than 350 abstracts, chapters, and peer-reviewed manuscripts. He is a senior editor of a major textbook, *Principles of Critical Care*, now entering its fourth edition. He has lectured on diverse topics related to the diagnosis and management of critical illness, and is a co-director of the American College of Chest Physician's Board Review in Critical Care and co-director of the American Thoracic Society's Pulmonary and Critical Care State-of-the-Art Course.
