

Decision Making

High Risk: Students who are unlikely to make good decisions.

Medium Risk: Students who are somewhat likely to making good decisions.

Low Risk: Students who are very likely to make good decisions.

Evaluation results of pre-and post-tests **show improvement for all risk levels, with more students ending up in a lower-risk category after program participation.** Total percentage of improvement is approximately 6.3%.

Goal-Setting

Hi Risk: Students who are unlikely to set goals.

Medium Risk: Students who are somewhat likely to set goals.

Low Risk: Students who are very likely to set goals.

Evaluation results of pre-and post-tests **show improvement for all risk levels with more students ending up in a lower-risk category after program participation.** Total percentage of improvement is approximately 10%.

Refusal Skills

High Risk: Students who are unlikely to say no to smoking.

Medium Risk: Students who are somewhat likely to say no to smoking.

Low Risk: Students who are is very likely to say no to smoking.

Evaluation results of pre-and post-tests **show improvement for all risk level, with more students ending up in a lower-risk category after program participation.** Total percentage of improvement is approximately 5.5%.

Attitudes Toward Smoking

High Risk: Students who have pro-smoking attitude.

Medium Risk: Students who are ambivalent toward smoking.

Low Risk: Students who are anti-smoking attitude.

Evaluation results of pre-and post-tests **show improvement for all risk level, with more students ending up in a lower-risk category after program participation.** Total percentage of improvement is approximately 5.3%.

Health Beliefs

High Risk: Students who are not educated on the effects of smoking.

Medium Risk: Students who are slightly educated on effects of smoking.

Low Risk: Students who are very educated on the effects of smoking.

Evaluation results of pre-and post-tests **show improvement for all risk level, with more students ending up in a lower-risk category after program participation.** Total percentage of improvement is approximately 11%.

The last measure **Intention to Use Tobacco** shows no statistically significant change. It is important to note that in this category 93% of the students already tested “low risk” before program initiation. The goal, therefore, is ***to see no to little change*** in this area.
